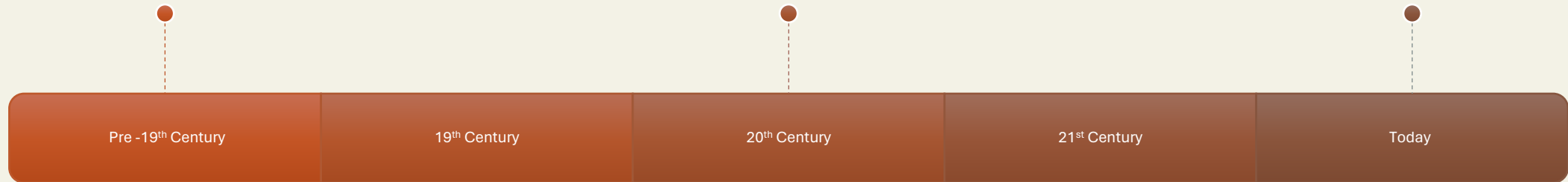


# UK Marketplace
